Disinfecting	Destroying or inactivating most germs on any inanimate object, but not bacterial spores. Disinfecting may be appropriate for
	diaper tables, door and cabinet handles, toilets, and other bathroom surfaces.
Germs	Microscopic living things (such as bacteria, viruses, parasites, and fungi) that cause disease.
